## **Hurricane Preparedness Checklist**

_ <b>Water Supply</b> - Have on hand before hurricane arrives. Supplies will be
limited when a storm is approaching. Four (4) gallons per family of four
per day for cooking and drinking.
 <b>Batteries</b> - Have on hand a supply that can provide power for flashlights
and radios.
 <b>Radio</b> - have a battery powered radio in your home to provide your family a source of information during the storm.
<b>Food Items</b> - Stock food items that have long storage life and do not necessarily require cooking. In addition, if you have a LP gas camp/barbecue grill, purchase propane before the storm approaches.
 _Secure Your Church and Parsonage - Inspect your church and
parsonage for tree branches hanging over your roof. Trim your trees before hurricane season. Secure all large windows and sliding glass doors with shutters, plywood or cardboard to help prevent your windows from breaking.
Have A Safe Room - Select a room in your house that is free of
windows. The room should be large enough for everyone in the house to fit. The safe room is also the place to be if there is a tornado warning.
_ Know Your Neighbor - Get to know your neighbors; help each other
out. A storm can damage one house and the house next door can go completely unharmed. Good neighbors can assist each other during weather generated disasters.
_Shelter-In-Place - High winds, tornados, and flooding can be extremely
hazardous. If you must go out, be sure to tell someone and only go for
an emergency.
 _ Know Your Insurance Company - If a problem arrives at your church
or parsonage, contact your insurance agent. You will be asked for your
church location, church name and a description of the damage. If you sustain substantial damage, and have to leave a message, leave your name, which church you are from and a contact phone number.
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
